
ORDER



REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

To the Honorable State Personnel Board of Review:

This cause comes on due to a review of the information contained in the record. On December 7, 2009, this Board issued a Procedural Order and Questionnaire, instructing Appellant to respond to the Questionnaire on or before December 31, 2009. A copy of the Procedural Order and Questionnaire was sent by certified mail to the parties, and Appellant signed for receipt of the item. To date, this Board has received no response from Appellant.

Pursuant to O.A.C. 124-9-05, this Board has the authority to order evidence taken in the form of questionnaires at any time prior to hearing. O.A.C. 124-9-05(C) provides that the failure to respond to a questionnaire may result in dismissal of a case, and Appellant was so apprised in the Board's December 7, 2009, Procedural Order.

Therefore, as Appellant has failed to respond as ordered by this Board to its Procedural Order and Questionnaire, I respectfully **RECOMMEND** that the instant appeal be **DISMISSED**, in accordance with O.A.C. 124-9-05.
