



**REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION**

To the Honorable State Personnel Board of Review:

This cause comes on due to a review of the information contained in the record. On March 2, 2011, this Board issued correspondence to Appellant, instructing him to provide the Board with information alleging with particularity the requirements of civil service law which he believed to have been violated by Appellee. Such information was required to be postmarked not later than March 18, 2011, and Appellant was notified that failure to provide the requested information would result in a dismissal of his case. To date, this Board has received no response from Appellant.

Therefore, because Appellant's request for investigation fails to allege with particularity any violation of the civil service law to which Appellee may be required to respond, or over which this Board may exercise its investigatory jurisdiction, I respectfully **RECOMMEND** that the instant appeal be **DISMISSED**.
